After talking at length, Megan and I decided it was time to speak to Pastor Joey. God arranged for his availability and we met at the Church that afternoon before the evening services. After Pastor Joey spent time with Megan, he gave her time to spend time talking with Jesus in prayer. It was then jointly decided that she would come forward to make her decision public in the evening service, but Megan was so happy that she told the first person that came to church that evening, Ms. Kay Davis who was Megan's sitter from the time she was born until she started to school. She did come forward in the evening service and was set aside for baptism.

It was a great honor to see Pastor Joey baptize Megan in the same outdoor baptistery that her Nana, her parents, her sister and cousin Scott had been baptized

in, but more importantly, in the presence and in the Name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. May we as a church family rejoice with Megan and her family, pray for her, and continue to guide and encourage her in her spiritual growth.
