The Pastor's Corner - " The Joy of Worship"

One of the great joys in my Christian experience has been the engagement with my Savior in Worship. Worship is one of those cherished privileges we have as Christians and as God's children. Psalm 46:11 says, "So the King will greatly desire your beauty; because He is your Lord worship Him" Psalm 95:6 says, "Oh come, let us worship and bow down let us kneel before the Lord our maker." One of the specific ways we honor our Lord is by our attentive, and focused lifestyle that centers our very thought process upon bringing pleasure and honor to our Lord. Particularly speaking here are; (1) The body of Christ; every born again believer is a part of the body of Christ. Ephesians 2:1-10 says that part of becoming a Christian is being united with other believers in the body of Christ. So much of belonging to the body of Christ is the unity and fellowship that is engaged in binding souls together as one.
